Construction updates

Find out more about our ongoing works as part of Phase 1 below:



Works are progressing well with all six buildings now well underway.



Our external frame and façade works are continuing to progress, and our internal fit-out works are also now fully underway.



Temporary traffic lights will remain in place on the Northern pedestrian bridge, while on the Southern pedestrian bridge the footpath will remain closed as works continue.



Lane closures will continue to be put into effect during the week from **7pm – 11pm** for deliveries to collect materials and equipment at the Southern pedestrian footbridge.



Works are planned to take place every Sunday in June, as well as 2 July, from 8am – 5pm in order to provide a new power supply to the Southern pedestrian bridge. These are unfortunately the only times that we can install this supply without impacting on the road network.



Works are also planned to be carried out during Sundays or midweek between **10pm and 6am until 15 June** while trains aren't running to remove some of the temporary works.

Woodland clearing

Our Capital team braved the sunshine to clear a woodland in Stratford donated to local charity Ambition Aspire Achieve – who aim to support some of the most disadvantaged families in Newham.

"I'm the Development Director for TwelveTrees Park. I take overall responsibility for all the works, and have a fantastic team to help deliver our commitments."




Mari Chisholm Community Engagement Manager
